Election Day Voting

ALABAMA IDs FOR VOTING

Unexpired Photo ID at the polls:

- AL Driver's license or Nondriver ID #
- State-Issued ID (AL or any other state)
- AL Voter ID Card
- Federal-government issued ID including US Passport
- Employee ID from governmental entity of Federal Government or AL
- Student or employee ID from AL post-high school institution
- Student or employee ID from state institution of higher learning in any other state
- Military ID
- Tribal ID

or expired less than 60 days

If an eligible voter doesn't have a valid ID and is positively identified by 2 election officials, they can so state in a sworn affidavit so such voter can vote a regular ballot.

Amendments

1. Allows the state legislature to provide for offenses for which bail may be denied
2. Allows local governments to use federal funding provided for broadband internet infrastructure and award such funds to public or private entities
3. Requires the Governor to provide notice to the Attorney General and the victim's family before granting a commutation or reprieve of a death sentence
4. Requires changes to laws governing the conduct of a general election to be implemented at least six months from the general election
5. Removes orphans' business from the jurisdiction of county probate courts
6. Authorizes specific cities to use a previously established property tax to directly fund capital improvements in addition to using the revenue to repay bonds and other debt
7. Specifies that counties and municipalities have authority to provide for financing economic and industrial development through the use of public funds, issuing bonds, and leasing property or lending bonds to a private entity
8. Provides that the Public Service Commission shall regulate certain private sewer systems in Shelby County
9. Provides that the Public Service Commission shall regulate certain private sewer systems in the town of Lake View
10. Authorizes the Code Commissioner to incorporate voter-approved amendments that are on the May or November 2022 ballot to the new state constitution (contingent on voter approval of the new state constitution ratification question)
